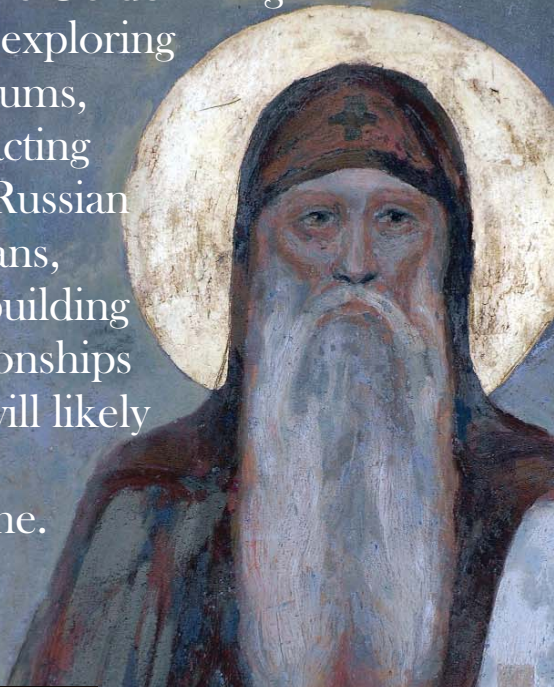


Orphan's Tree invites you to come on a once-in-a-lifetime experience in Russia.
